**Access and Use:** The Otis Historical Archives is committed to providing open access to its collections as far as possible within the limits of privacy and confidentiality. **Series/Scope and Content Note:** The purpose of this card catalog reference system (date of creation unknown) was to serve as a cross-reference of Museum numbering systems, principally for the Anatomical and Historical divisions. Over the years, many notations have been made on the cards and those handwritten notes can provide useful information for any given object. What can also be ascertained from the cards are numbers that have been re-used. Most notably in the historical section, original number cards have been marked as “discarded,” noting what objects were deaccessioned or discarded and segregated in the back, while newer cards show the number was re-assigned to a new object.

**Arrangement:** This collection is housed in a card file cabinet. The record-keeping system is no longer kept up-to-date, but is regularly used in research. Its original order has been retained.
