Historical Note: This collection is part of the curatorial records section of the Otis Historical Archives. This section and specific collection (OHA 3) relate to the early history of the Army Medical Museum (AMM), now the National Museum of Health and Medicine (NMHM). The AMM was established in 1862, at the beginning of the Civil War, to document battlefield medicine, trauma, and pathology through the collection of records, specimens, and artifacts. The curatorial records document the mission, work, and day-to-day activities of the museum up through the end of World War II, when the museum became a component of the Army Institute of Pathology, LATER the Armed Forces Institute of Pathology.

Scope and Content Note: This collection consists of correspondence to the Surgeon General about the plans, specifications, and construction estimates of post hospitals at various camps and forts (including Camp Del Rio, Texas; Ft. Reno, Indian Territory; Washington Barracks, Washington, DC; Ft. Columbus, New York). This also includes requisitions and estimates for repair or furnishing of various post hospitals. The records appear to have been forwarded to Army Medical Museum curator John Billings for comment after his work on the "Report on the Hygiene of the U.S. Army" (1875).
