Biographical Note: Dr. David Jayne was a physician and manufacturer of patent medicines from Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. A graduate of the University of Pennsylvania Medical School (circa 1825), Jayne was a direct mail merchant of medicinal, home-made curatives. The firm's most prominent product was introduced in 1831, under the title Dr. Jayne's Carminative Balsam. The company moved to Philadelphia from New Jersey in 1848, and subsequently added family members to the practice, as Dr. D. Jayne & Sons and later Dr. D. Jayne's Family Medicine. They continued operations into the early part of the 20th century.

Scope and Content Note: This collection contains the business receipts and logbook of Dr. David Jayne's Family Medicine. It records patients and medicines administered to them from 1866 to 1877. It also identifies William B. Rowland and Joseph N. Tosh as medical doctors. Business receipts are addressed to Rowland & Tosh, Rowlandsville, Maryland, dated from 1868 to 1876.
